



Conclusions

- 1- national journals is a proper denomination in the case of emerging and developing countries, in the sense that they are dedicated to publish national articles primarily (They give vent to national articles)
- 2-For journals published in developed countries articles from this same country are in general a minority
- 3- In the case of the 5 emerging countries citing articles from other countries are slightly more than citing articles from the own country. In developed countries the difference is much higher. Although not shown, for articles from Sweden published in 2010-2011, for instance, 85% of the citations were from other countries.
